1970's – Introductory Lesson

The purpose of this lesson is to get an idea of what the children already know about the subject. It is a co-operative lesson for the whole class to get involved. Spelling and handwriting are not important.

At the end of the topic it will be useful to re-visit the results of this lesson and hold a class Q&A to discuss what they have found out and any unanswered questions they still have. The Q&A could be part of an ICT lesson where the children research their unanswered questions.

SPLIT THE GROUPS

In order to get randomly selected groups ask the children to sort themselves into date of birth order without talking to each other. Then split the children into groups of 4 i.e. the first 4 children are one group etc.

Once in their groups the following jobs should be randomly allocated:

- 1. Group Leader (who likes cheese?)
- 2. Writer (who has the next birthday?)
- 3. Reporter (who has the longest name?)
- 4. Timer (who has a necklace on?)

Sheets of A2 paper are laid out on the desks each sheet should be labelled with one of these titles:

- 1. Major Events
- 2. Life at Home
- 3. Technology
- 4. Entertainment
- 5. Fashion
- 6. Toys and Games

Then split the sheet into two columns:

- 1. What do I know?
- 2. What do I want to find out?

The groups then rotate around each sheet. A time limit should be given.



Major Events TEACHER'S NOTES

The 1970's is a decade which started in 1970 and ended in 1979. Lots of interesting and important things happened during the 1970's. In this part we will look at some of the major events of the 1970's.

1971 – DISNEY WORLD OPENS Disney World in Florida, USA opened on October 1st 1971. Admission prices in 1971 were \$1 for children and \$3.50 for adults.

DECIMAL DAY – On February 15th 1971 the UK made changes to its currency. Before decimalisation there were 240 pence in the pound, 12 pence in a shilling and 20 shillings in a pound.

1973 – FUEL CRISIS In 1973 complex economic and political situations caused a fuel shortage in the UK and other countries. The shortage caused fuel prices to increase, this meant that petrol was rationed, there were frequent power cuts and people often worked a three day week.

EUROPE REFERENDUM Prime Minister Harold Wilson and his Labour Government held a referendum to ask the public if the wanted to remain in the European Economic Community or not. The people voted to stay in Europe, in contrast with the 2016 referendum where it was decided Britain should leave the European Union. 1975 – NORTH SEA OIL Various oil fields were discovered under the North Sea in the early 1970's. In 1975, Queen Elizabeth II opened the UK's first oil pipeline which brought oil from the Forties oilfield near Aberdeen to Grangemouth.

1977 – Queen Elizabeth II celebrated herSilver Jubilee in 1977 to mark 25 yearssince she became the British monarch.People celebrated with street parties!

1978 – Louise Brown, the world's first IVF baby was born on July 25th in Oldham. 1979 – Barr's sell Irn Bru in a plastic bottle for the first time.

1979 – SCOTTISH DEVOLUTION Scots have a vote on devolution. A referendum takes place to decide whether Scotland should have an independent Scottish Assembly. Less than 40% of the electorate voted yes.

ACTIVITY 1

Problem Solving and Mapping

CO-OPERATIVE LEARNING

The children are asked to work with partners but you could use larger groups.

EXTENSION TASK

The children could report back to the class using Google Earth on the smart board to show the places they have found.

PEER ASSESSMENT

The children could work together to compare answers.

ACTIVITY 2 <u>Art</u>
